


When you are working with people of different generations, especially with kids, you can't plan things too carefully. The trick is to create a framework that is loose enough to accommodate everyone's interests and abilities, but strong enough to create a performance that is coherent and

In creating Family Duet, our goal has been to understand how life's big questions are present in the seemingly small and ordinary world of the family. The home is where you can 'be yourself'. But it is also a place of ritual and repetition, of conflict and confusion, of familiar objects and strange choreographies. These are, of course, very theatrical things, so instead of dramatizing our lives, we have been working on bringing out the theatricality inherent in the domestic world.

We have interviewed each other around the dining table, created picture-stories about the houses we have lived in, and made up dances about scooters and satellites. We also use toys and other household objects to create simple scenes that explore the themes of time and identity, living and dying, and the oddly-shaped emotional rollercoaster that parent-child relationships take you on.

We present this show in loving memory of Ron Rae (1948-2010).

Spell Seven Performance Club was established by Paul Rae and Kaylene Tan in 1997. The company creates theatre and site specific performances exploring the intersections of history, identity and daily life.

Duets is a series of pseudo-autobiographical performances about the power of two in a world of many. They have been presented in Singapore and internationally, in theatres and on audio. Over the years, Paul and Kaylene have duetted together (*Duets*, 2004-2005), alone (*Duets* 2, 2006), with trees (*Tree* Duet, 2007-2010) and with the sky (Sky Duet, 2008). Family Duet is the latest addition.

Other theatre performances include National Language Class (2005-2008), Dream-Work / Dream-Home (2010-2011) and Epic Poem of Malaya (2011). A comprehensively documented version of National Language Class is now available for purchase on DVD. Contact paul@spell7.net for details. 
